

Pursuant to [N.C. G.S. 132-1.4A](#), law enforcement agencies may allow any who meets the criteria listed below to VIEW digital media. They may view it in the presence of an officer but may not attempt to preserve or record any part of the digital media.

Pursuant to [N.C. G.S. 132-1.4A](#), law enforcement agencies may allow any person who meets these criteria to RECEIVE A RECORDING OF digital media. They shall be provided with a copy of the digital media as specified in the court order. This may limit the release to a certain time frames of the media, at the court's discretion.
